REQUEST FOR ASSOCIATION

PhD researchers, who are pursuing their dissertation within one of HEIBRiDS' core scientific disciplines (medicine, astronomy, geosciences, transportation and energy), are invited to apply for association with the HEIBRiDS PhD training program.

Requirements for association are:

- Candidates are in their first year of doctoral research
- Their doctoral project is interdisciplinary in nature
- A supervision/mentorship according to the HEIBRiDS principle* is in place or can be arranged
- They are willing to actively participate in the HEIBRiDS training program

Candidates need to submit the following documents:

1. Completed form "Request for Association"
2. Letter of Motivation describing why they want to join the HEIBRiDS program
3. CV including education details, publications, honours, etc.
4. Abstract of the dissertation project (1-2 pages)
5. Letter of support from the supervisor approving the HEIBRiDS application
6. Statement of approval from the potential mentor

Requests for Association are accepted all year round and are evaluated by the HEIBRiDS Program Committee. Decisions will be made based on the scientific quality and collaborative potential of the proposed project, as well as the competence and motivation of the candidate. *According to the "HEIBRiDS principle" all doctoral projects combine Data Science aspects with another discipline. All HEIBRiDS students have two supervisors: one from a partner Helmholtz Center and one from an ECDF partner university. For Associated HEIBRiDS students, the second supervisor may have the role of a mentor; that is, it is not required to be officially registered as the second supervisor.
